# A Message from Kerry Steever, Placerville Camp Director>>>

Greetings from Placerville Camp!

We are excited to send out this message to let you know that we will be opening up for summer programming! YAY!!

Obviously with COVID still in full swing, as of right now, there will be some changes from the norm and we hope that by the time summer reaches us, we can change our course of action.

First off, all campers and staff will be wearing masks while indoors, except while sleeping. Campers will receive a cloth mask once they arrive and disposable masks will also be available. Campers, however, will be encouraged to bring their own masks as well as hand sanitizer.

Second, we will be restricting the number of campers that can attend. Youth camps will have a limit of 30 campers so that we can keep a ratio of 1 counselor to 5 campers. This will allow safer sleeping arrangements in the cabins. Women's Camp will also have a limit of 30 participants. Campers will also be doing most of their activities within their family groups which includes meals times.

Third, registration will be on-line only, so a camp brochure will not be mailed out. On-line registration will allow us to keep track of the numbers as registrations are made in real time. We can keep track of numbers better this way. This can be done at **placervillecamp.net.** 

On-line registration also allows us to notify campers as guidelines change where we might have the need to adjust our protocols.

We would appreciate your helping get the word out to your congregation. Please pass on the website **placervillecamp.net** so folks will know where to get their information.

More information will be coming as time goes on. With many prayers, maybe we can lift the limit on numbers as summer draws near. We look forward to seeing you at camp!

## Pastor Tím's Tídbíts>>>

#### **LENT AND LOVE**

Since we will be celebrating both the liturgical season of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 17, and Valentine's Day on February 14, I thought we'd consider for a moment thoughts on "Lent and Love."

Lent is truly a season of love. I can hear you saying, "Pastor Tim, Lent is supposed to be a time of penitence, prayer, fasting and 'giving something up', isn't it? Where does Love figure into the equation?" (You DID ask yourself that question, didn't you?) Let me suggest that Lent actually requires Love on two levels.

First of all, we know that Lent is the 40 day season (not counting Sundays) before Palm Sunday, so it is a time in which we prepare ourselves for Holy Week, from Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, to his cleansing of the Temple, to The Lord's Supper, to Gethsemane, to Herod and Pilate, to Calvary, to the tomb, and to the Resurrection. What are we preparing for? We are preparing for the celebration of a LOVE we cannot fully comprehend. We are preparing for an event which exhibits God's Love for us, you and me, by sacrificing his Son.

Such agape (unconditional) love is almost foreign to us. I've said time and again that the closest example of human agape love is a Mother's love. Yet we know there are abusive mothers and negligent mothers, so that comparison is not perfect. But there are examples of such love around us. Just a few days ago a new article told of a mother who found out she had cancer in her 4<sup>th</sup> month of pregnancy. To undergo treatment would be to abort her child. She chose to delay treatment until her child was born. The child was born prematurely but is alive and well. The mother took treatments for a short time before the cancer overcame her and she died. She gave her life that her child would live. That's close to agape love, isn't it? But isn't quite the same as Jesus' death. To be the same, we would need to find a father or mother willing to have his or her child die to save the lives of others. We can't really relate to that because we don't even want to consider being in such a situation. As a father and grandfather I confess that I don't even want to THINK about losing one of my children or grandchildren. (For those of you who have experienced such a loss, my heart goes out to you.) But God's agape love was such that he allowed Jesus to be scourged, mocked and killed to help us understand God's love for us. That is the first and greatest level of Love as we enter Lent.

The second level of Love during Lent is OUR love. How do we respond to God's love for us?

Can we and will we celebrate Lent in the tradition of prayer, penitence, charitable giving and self-denial? Can we express our love for God by say... setting aside 5 minutes each day for prayer? Can we express our love for God by truly looking at our lives and repenting from some sin during Lent? Can we increase our giving to our church or other charity during Lent? Can we deny ourselves something we like (or isn't good for us) during Lent?

We can do nothing about the first level of love we experience during Lent. God's love for us is so great! But there is something we can do on our level. We can improve our prayer life. We can improve our charitable giving. We can give up something for those 40 days (scripture tells us that Jesus gave up food for 40 days!)

I challenge you to personally respond to God's love in a real way this Lenten season as we prepare ourselves for God's greatest gift, the gift of salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

(Oh, by the way, feel free to express love on a third level by giving your loved ones a symbol of your love for them on Val(Lent)ine's Day!)
